The competition

We want Easter-themed artworks! We have provided two paper templates that contestants can decorate however they wish; from paints and pens to pipe cleaners and sequins.

The template is just one suggestion, and we're happy to receive any Easter-themed artwork, this could be three-dimensional and made of polystyrene or papier-mâché, or even a video or sound clip.

A selection of entrants will be displayed in the Houses of Parliament in mid-March.

The winning contestants will receive a range of art supplies.
