#### Important information

#### Service User Representative events

This year we trialled three Meet Your Service User events. These were intended to be informal get togethers where people could meet Debbie Clark, as well as each other. We planned them in Edinburgh, Forfar and Aberdeen to try to make them as accessible as possible. We also provided refreshments and invited people to book their place so we could cater accordingly. Five people attended the events in Edinburgh and Forfar, and we had to cancel the Aberdeen event as only one person had let us know they were able to attend. We are currently trying to think of better ways for our service users to get to meet Debbie and would be grateful if you have any ideas. #### Fireworks season

We have put together some advice to help keep your guide dogs and puppies safe during fireworks season:

- Make sure your dog has a good walk before dark so they are tired and relaxed for the evening.
- Feed your dog earlier than usual so they can relieve themselves before the fireworks start.
- Make sure your dog is wearing their collar and their ID tag is up-to-date, just in case they escape when the fireworks are going off.
- Prepare an area for your dog to go if it becomes scared. If they already have a crate, cover it with a blanket to make a quiet, dark den. You



- could also use a table or a cupboard under the stairs with an open door.
- Put a TV or radio on to help hide the noise of fireworks.
- Make sure you have everything you need for the evening so you can stay at home with your dog.

If you are having difficulties with your guide dog or puppy because of fireworks, please contact the team.
