#TakeTheLead We held over 1,000 positive conversations with the public and ended the campaign with a sponsored dog walk, all helping to promote responsible dog ownership. Suffolk Constabulary agreed to review their Service Level Agreement regarding the Dangerous Dogs Act. Since the campaign we have had one attack in Ipswich. Prior to this we experienced 11 attacks. This campaign has yielded fantastic results. Thank you to all the volunteers and partners who supported it. We could not have done it without you!

Raising awareness of cycling hazards: Our volunteers do amazing things for Guide Dogs; this is just one of those fantastic initiatives. Tracey Wright has recently become a campaigns volunteer. Listening to her fiancé and other guide dog owners talk about the perils of people cycling on the pavements, Tracey decided to do something to help our cause. During 5 talks at a local secondary school, she spoke to over 1300 students about the issues faced by our service users from people cycling and parking on pavements. Well done Tracey, it sounds like a great success.
