Setting up for success

Now that you have signed up to your challenge, here are some quick and easy steps which will help to set you up for fundraising success:

Fundraising online



Head to [justgiving.com/guidedogs](https://www.justgiving.com/guidedogs) to set up your fundraising page. Fundraising online is easy, quick and secure. Best of all, the donations are automatically sent to Guide Dogs meaning less admin for you (and us!). Plus Gift Aid can be claimed, making your sponsorship go even further.

You can personalise your page too with pictures, stories and more. We'd recommend including a little about your event and why you've chosen to support Guide Dogs.

Set a target - aim high!

Setting a target is a great way to keep motivated and it also helps to encourage your sponsors to help you reach your goal.

Share your story - don't be shy!

Tell your friends, family, neighbours, colleagues about the incredible challenge you are undertaking. Share by email, text, on your social platforms, via posters or word of mouth. Sharing your fundraising page far and wide will help you smash your target!

Tips to help hit your goal



Puppy sweepstake



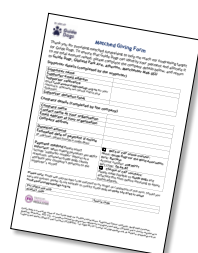
A puppy sweepstake could boost your total by a minimum of £30.

Coin collector



Your puppy coin collector could raise £25 every time it's filled, plus it's re-usable.

Matched Giving Scheme



Ask your employer if they will double the amount you raise through their matched giving scheme. Even if you fundraise outside of work, you could still be eligible.

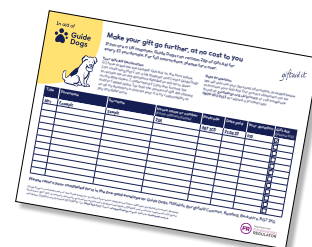
Go cashless

Some people no longer carry coins on them. So make collecting your funds a doddle by setting up an online fundraising page at justgiving.com/guidedogs.

You can even get a unique QR code to scan. For example, if your page is justgiving.com/fundraising/MrFundraiser simply add /qr code at the end and click enter. Print this code and place it by your money box for cashless donations.

Gift Aid

If you receive donations towards your fundraising from a UK taxpayer, Guide Dogs can reclaim 25p of Gift Aid for every £1 donated. This is done automatically on JustGiving, or for cash donations you can simply place our Gift Aid form next to your money box and encourage supporters to fill it in.



Familiarise yourself with what is and isn't eligible for Gift Aid using the form. For example, any donation being in exchange for an item such as a piece of cake, ticket, or sweepstake, is not eligible.

Meet Murray

Murray and his dad Stewart are a guided running pair who crossed the finish line first at the Guide Dogs Run in Glasgow.

Murray was nine years old when he started losing his sight due to a condition called optic atrophy, and over two years lost his sight in both eyes. He has adapted amazingly well and challenges himself every day. He loves to keep fit and takes part in judo three times a week at both his club and Judo Scotland, as well as being part of the GB Para Potential Team.

Guide Dogs Specialists from Guide Dogs have supported Murray with mobility and habilitation training, helping him be confident enough to travel on the bus to neighbouring towns on his own.

Gather your team and bring out a competitive edge to your fundraising. From a Guide Dogs themed quiz to a charity sports match, or even an office Olympics – let the games begin!



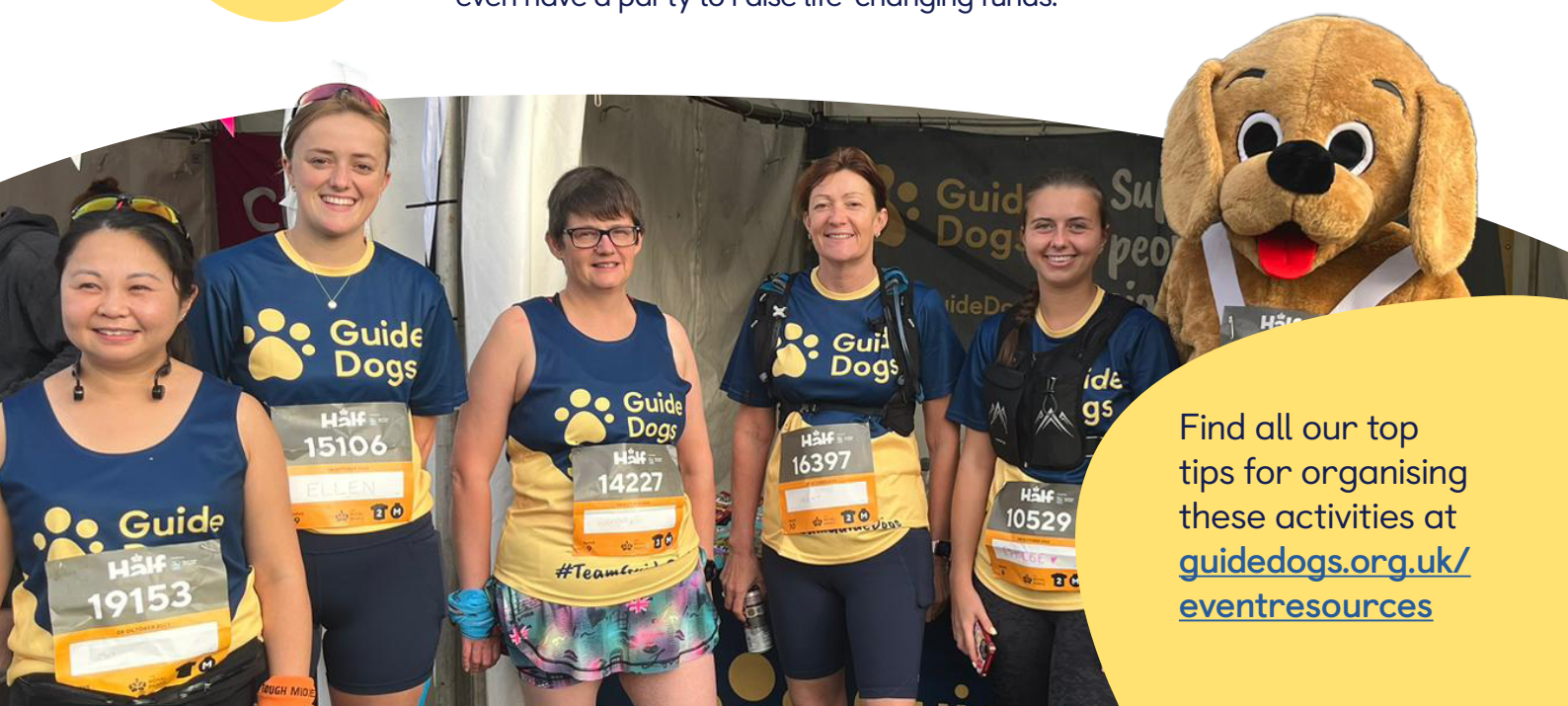
Eyes on the prize

Every penny counts

Your fundraising makes a big difference. By sharing your story and your sponsorship goal, you'll raise more!



£26

could buy a white harness, the iconic symbol of a working guide dog.



£80

could buy a puppy raising kit for the volunteers who look after our puppies during their first year.



£250

every day 250 people start to lose their sight in the UK – why not aim to raise £250?



£1,800

could buy a young person a laptop kit, complete with assistive technology such as Supernova magnifier and speech.

Choose a goal linked to your fundraising:



Walking 10km

Ask everyone to donate £10 each in sponsorship.



Running a marathon?

£26 per sponsor could go a long way.

Don't forget

If you hit your goal early, you can always increase it!

More than just words

Use photos, video, or even a livestream to bring your fundraising story to life. With just a few seconds to grab someone's attention, a good picture is worth 1,000 words.

Top tips for great pics:

- **Wipe the lens**
Avoid pics blurring from fingerprints – especially if snapping with your phone.
- **Be the star of the shoot**
Even if you're camera shy – everyone wants to see you having fun while fundraising.
- **Include Guide Dogs**
Make sure it's obvious you're part of **#TeamGuideDogs** with your branded fundraising tools or t-shirt.
- **Before, during... and after!**
Tell your whole fundraising story with a mix of action and posed shots.
- **High resolution**
Ensure your pics are over 1MB so they can be used anywhere – even a local newspaper.

Up to a fifth of your donations come in after your fundraising activity has finished because everyone can see how much effort you've put in. Be sure to follow up and thank everyone who donated so they know how much their support means to you.

At the bank or bank transfer

By cheque

Send a cheque made payable to 'Guide Dogs Events' to **Guide Dogs, Hillfields, Burghfield Common, Reading, RG7 3YG**. Remember to include your details on the back of the cheque and your sponsor forms.
